

## Maths

The children will continue to develop their skills in multiplication and division. They will then be applying these to word problems and real life contexts. Our focus will then move on to revision of all four operations. We will be exploring fractions of shapes and then numbers before considering equivalent fractions and adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator. The children will be learning the decimal equivalents of fractions and how to divide numbers by 10 and 100. All through the half term we will be rehearsing our times tables.

## English

Our English lessons will include role play scenarios considering the invasion of the Saxons, and then Saxon village life. The children will research many aspects of Anglo-Saxons through drama, research and literature, and create their own information texts from this. The children will write their own story based upon being transported back to the Anglo-Saxon times.

## History/Geography

Leading on from the children's previous learning of Romans, the children will become 'archaeologists' and investigate Sutton Hoo, an ancient Anglo-Saxon discovery. They will explore Anglo-Saxon village life first hand. This will be through a creative curriculum approach, where much of the learning will be hands on!

## Computing

We will be using the internet as a research tool. The children will develop their presentation skills using different programmes alongside their typing skills. They will create power points to support their learning.

## French

This half term, the children will be revising all the themes taught over the year.

## P.S.H.E.

The PSHE areas this term are Drug Education and Sexual Relationships Education. A separate information sheet has been handed out.

## RE

Pentecost and Revelation. The children will explore the story of Pentecost and the message of good news. They will consider how they too can spread good news to others.

## Music

The children will learn about Anglo-Saxon culture and the importance of music and storytelling at that time. They will make their own lyre, harp or recorder and play this to accompany a story telling session. They will learn the 'Song Of Caedmon' and the significance of this.

## P.E.

The children will be improving their skills in rounders, participating in swimming lessons and sports day, and experiencing an afternoon of tri golf. In addition to this the children will continue to take part in weekly outdoor learning sessions, working towards their John Muir award.

## Science

The children will consider why the remains at Sutton Hoo were as they were. Linking to our musical instrument making, the children will explore how to alter the pitch of the notes.

## Art & Design

The children will be immersed in all things Anglo-Saxon:- Dyeing, basket making, weaving, creating a Saxon village, rune writing and creating a Saxon meal.
